⁶⁻Residue is primarily material received in the containers stream which does not meet product delivery standards and glass. In 2012 the majority of glass was landfilled as a waste residue due to difficulties in finding markets and changes in the statute prohibiting its use as landfill cover. The above figures for municipalities do not include residue. However, the totals are net of MRF
